South Africa Update – SA terminal Transnet IT disruption

Following up on our advisory of 28th July we can advise that the Transnet Port Terminals (TPT) teams are making every effort to recover from the impact of the outage of the terminal operating system (Navis). The container terminals are operational and as per the latest update received, we can now access the Navis system to pre-advise containers. TPT are still working on full restoration of the EDI nationally and other internal operational functions in the Ngqura, and Port Elizabeth. The Transnet emails are being restored.

Below you can find a status update of the affected ONE services & vessels:

Capetown

- SAS service – M/V NYK Fuji – Vessel departure delayed by poor weather conditions. New ETD 31st July early morning.
- SRX service - M/V Santa Clara – Vessel berthed earlier this week and operations started today at 14h00.
- AIM service – M/V Xpress Karakorum – Vessel omitted Cape Town and proceeds for West Africa
- AIM service – M/V NYK Paula is on its way to Cape Town. Awaiting berth window confirmation.
- SRX Service – M/V Santa Ursula – As a result of the berthing delays it was decided to omit the Cape Town southbound call and proceed to Coega NCT.

Coega/Port Elizabeth

- SRX service – M/V Santa Isabel is waiting at anchorage.

Durban

- SAC service – M/V ZIM Shanghai – Vessel sailed from Durban.
- SRX service – M/V DAL Kalahari operating at Durban.
- SAS service - M/V Ever Devote - Vessel at anchorage at Durban. Berthing is expected Sunday 1st August.
- SAC service – M/V Ever United - Vessel at anchorage at Durban. Berthing expected Saturday 31st July.
- SAS service - M/V Kota legit – Vessel at anchorage at Durban. Berthing expected Tuesday 3rd August.

We continue to monitor the situation and as and when more news becomes available we will inform you.
